In accordance with 37 C.F.R. § 90.2(a)(3)(ii), Patent Owner indicates that the issues on appeal include, but are not limited to (1) whether the Board erred in finding that challenged claims 6–8 are unpatentable under 35 U.S.C. §103 as being obvious over Skatulla; (2) whether the Board erred in finding that challenged claims 3, 6, 8, 13, 25, 27, 29, 30, and 34 are unpatentable under 35 U.S.C. § 103 as being obvious over the combination of Leman and Skatulla; (3) whether the Board erred in finding that challenged claim 31 is are unpatentable under 35 U.S.C. §103 as being obvious over the combination of Leman, Skatulla, and Liaw; (4) whether the Board erred in finding that challenged claim 35 is unpatentable under 35 U.S.C. § 103 as being obvious over the combination of Leman, Skatulla, and Ichisa; (5) whether the Board erred in finding that challenged claims 3, 13, 25, 27, 29, 30, and 34 are unpatentable under 35 U.S.C. §103 as being obvious over the combination of Skatulla and the '369 patent; (6) whether the Board erred in finding that challenged claim 31 is unpatentable under 35 U.S.C. § 103 as being

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obvious over the combination of Skatulla, the '369 patent and Liaw; (7) whether

the Board erred in finding that challenged claim 35 is unpatentable under 35

U.S.C. §103 as being obvious over the combination of Skatulla, the '369 patent,

and Ichisa; (8) the Board's claim constructions or failure to construe any terms,

and (9) any findings or determinations supporting or related to the aforementioned

issues as well as other issues decided adversely to Patent Owner in any order,

decisions, rulings, or opinions.
