Plaintiff is informed and believes and based thereon alleges that said Defendant and DOES 1 through 10, inclusive, are in some manner responsible for the wrongs alleged herein, and that at all times referenced each was the agent and servant of the other Defendant and was acting within the course and scope of said agency and employment.
- Plaintiff is informed and believes, and based thereon alleges, that at all 7. relevant times herein, Defendant and DOES 1 through 10, inclusive, knew or reasonably should have known of the acts and behavior alleged herein and the damages caused thereby, and by their inaction ratified and encouraged such acts and behavior. - 11. Many of Deckers' UGG® footwear designs are protected by design patents issued by the United States Patent and Trademark Office. Design Patents for UGG® footwear include, but are not limited to, U.S. Patent Nos. D599,999 (registered on September 15, 1999), and D616,189 (registered on May 25, 2010) (hereinafter, collectively, "UGG Designs"). Attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 1 are true and correct copies of the registered design patents for the UGG Designs.
- 12. Deckers is the lawful assignee of all right, title, and interest in and to the UGG Designs.

# B. Defendant's Infringement of the UGG Designs

- 13. Upon information and belief, Plaintiff hereon avers that Defendant ShoeScandal.com, LLC advertises, offers for sale, and sells shoes through its online store <a href="https://www.shoescandal.com">www.shoescandal.com</a>.
- 14. Customers nationwide, including those within this judicial district, can purchase Defendant's shoes via its website <u>www.shoescandal.com</u>.





# FIRST CLAIM FOR RELIEF

(Patent Infringement – 35 U.S.C. § 271)

- 17. Plaintiff incorporates herein by reference the averments of the preceding paragraphs as though fully set forth herein.
- 18. Plaintiff Deckers Outdoor Corporation is the owner by assignment of all right, title and interest in and to the design patents for the UGG Designs.
- 19. Defendant has knowingly and intentionally manufactured, caused to be produced, distributed, advertised, marketed, offered for sale, and/or sold footwear that is nearly identical to the UGG Designs in direct violation of 35 U.S.C. § 271.
- 20. Defendant's use of the UGG Designs is without Plaintiff's permission or authority and is in total disregard of Plaintiff's right to control its intellectual property.

- 21. As a direct and proximate result of Defendant's infringing conduct, Plaintiff has been injured and will continue to suffer injury to its business and reputation unless Defendant is restrained by this Court from infringing Plaintiff's design patents.
- 22. Defendant's acts have damaged and will continue to damage Plaintiff, and Plaintiff has no adequate remedy at law.
- 23. On information and belief, Defendant's acts herein complained of constitute willful acts and intentional infringement of the UGG Designs.
- 24. In light of the foregoing, Plaintiff is entitled to injunctive relief prohibiting Defendant from using the UGG Designs and to recover from Defendant all damages, including attorneys' fees, that Plaintiff has sustained and will sustain as a result of such infringing acts, and all gains, profits and advantages obtained by Defendant as a result thereof, in an amount to be determined, which amount can be trebled under 35 U.S.C. § 284.

# **SECOND CLAIM FOR RELIEF**

# **Unfair Competition Under California Common Law**

- 25. Plaintiff incorporates herein by reference the averments of the preceding paragraphs as though fully set forth herein.
- 26. Defendant's infringement of Plaintiff's UGG Designs constitutes unfair competition in violation of the common law of the State of California.
- 27. Plaintiff has no adequate remedy at law to compensate it fully for the damages that have been caused and which will continue to be caused by Defendant's infringing conduct, unless it is enjoined by this Court.
- 28. In light of the foregoing, Plaintiff is entitled to injunctive relief prohibiting Defendant from using the UGG Designs, and to recover all damages, including attorneys' fees, that Plaintiff has sustained and will sustain, and all gains, profits and advantages obtained by Defendant as a result of its infringing acts alleged above in an amount not yet known, and the costs of this action.

# PRAYER FOR RELIEF

- 2. An order granting temporary, preliminary and permanent injunctive relief restraining and enjoining Defendant, its officers, agents, employees, and attorneys, and all those persons or entities in active concert or participation with them from:
- (a) manufacturing, importing, advertising, marketing, promoting, supplying, distributing, offering for sale, or selling any products that infringe upon the UGG Designs, including the Infringing Products;
- (b) engaging in any other activity constituting unfair competition with Plaintiff, or acts and practices that deceive consumers, the public, and/or trade, including without limitation, the use of designations and design elements used or owned by or associated with Plaintiff; and
- (c) committing any other act which falsely represents or which has the effect of falsely representing that the goods and services of Defendant are licensed by, authorized by, offered by, produced by, sponsored by, or in any other way associated with Plaintiff;
- 3. Ordering Defendant to recall from any distributors and retailers and to deliver to Plaintiff for destruction or other disposition all remaining inventory of all Infringing Products and related items, including all advertisements, promotional and marketing materials therefore, as well as means of making same;

- 4. Ordering Defendant to file with this Court and serve on Plaintiff within thirty (30) days after entry of the injunction a report in writing, under oath setting forth in detail the manner and form in which Defendant has complied with the injunction;
- 5. Ordering an accounting by Defendant of all gains, profits and advantages derived from their wrongful acts;
- Awarding Plaintiff all of Defendant's profits and all damages sustained by 6. Plaintiff as a result of Defendant's wrongful acts, and such other compensatory damages as the Court determines to be fair and appropriate;
- Increasing the damages up to three times the amount found or assessed 7. under 35 U.S.C. § 284;




























