1 Plaintiff **Deckers Outdoor Corporation** for its claims against Defendant
2 **ShoeScandal.com, LLC** respectfully alleges as follows:

3 **JURISDICTION AND VENUE**

4 1. Plaintiff files this action against Defendant for patent infringement arising
5 under the patent laws of the United States. This Court has subject matter jurisdiction
6 over the claims alleged in this action pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1331, 1338.

7 2. This Court has personal jurisdiction over Defendant because Defendant
8 does business within this judicial district.

9 3. This action arises out of wrongful acts by Defendant within this judicial
10 district and Plaintiff is located and has been injured in this judicial district by

1 Defendant's alleged wrongful acts. Venue is proper in this district pursuant to 28
2 U.S.C. § 1391 because the claims asserted arise in this district.

3 **THE PARTIES**

4 4. Plaintiff Deckers Outdoor Corporation ("Deckers") is a corporation
5 organized and existing under the laws of the state of Delaware with an office and
6 principal place of business in Goleta, California. Deckers designs and markets
7 footwear identified by its famous UGG® trademark and other famous trademarks.

8 5. Upon information and belief, Defendant ShoeScandal.com, LLC is a
9 limited liability company duly organized and existing under the laws of the state of
10 Nevada with an office and principal place of business at 555 West 59th Street, Suite 10-
11 H, New York, New York 10019.

12 6. Plaintiff is unaware of the names and true capacities of Defendants,
13 whether individual, corporate and/or partnership entities, named herein as DOES 1
14 through 10, inclusive, and therefore sues them by their fictitious names. Plaintiff will
15 seek leave to amend this complaint when their true names and capacities are
16 ascertained. Plaintiff is informed and believes and based thereon alleges that said
17 Defendant and DOES 1 through 10, inclusive, are in some manner responsible for the
18 wrongs alleged herein, and that at all times referenced each was the agent and servant
19 of the other Defendant and was acting within the course and scope of said agency and
20 employment.

21 7. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and based thereon alleges, that at all
22 relevant times herein, Defendant and DOES 1 through 10, inclusive, knew or
23 reasonably should have known of the acts and behavior alleged herein and the damages
24 caused thereby, and by their inaction ratified and encouraged such acts and behavior.
25 Plaintiff further alleges that Defendant and DOES 1 through 10, inclusive, have a non-
26 delegable duty to prevent or not further such acts and the behavior described herein,
27 which duty Defendant and DOES 1 though 10, inclusive, failed and/or refused to
28 perform.

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ALLEGATIONS COMMON TO ALL CAUSES OF ACTION

A. Deckers' UGG® Brand

8. Deckers has become well known throughout the United States and elsewhere as a source of high quality footwear products identified at least by its UGG® brand of premium footwear.

9. Deckers' UGG® products are distributed and sold to consumers through retailers throughout the United States at point of sale and on the Internet, including through its website www.uggaustralia.com.

10. Deckers has spent substantial time, effort, and money in designing, developing, advertising, promoting, and marketing its famous UGG® Australia line of footwear. Deckers' efforts have been successful and Deckers has sold a substantial amount of UGG® Australia footwear.

11. Many of Deckers' UGG® footwear designs are protected by design patents issued by the United States Patent and Trademark Office. Design Patents for UGG® footwear include, but are not limited to, U.S. Patent Nos. D599,999 (registered on September 15, 1999), and D616,189 (registered on May 25, 2010) (hereinafter, collectively, "UGG Designs"). Attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 1 are true and correct copies of the registered design patents for the UGG Designs.

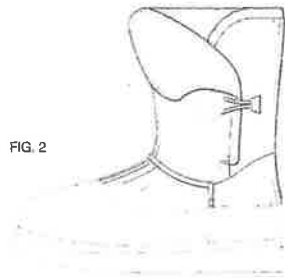
12. Deckers is the lawful assignee of all right, title, and interest in and to the UGG Designs.

B. Defendant's Infringement of the UGG Designs

13. Upon information and belief, Plaintiff hereon avers that Defendant ShoeScandal.com, LLC advertises, offers for sale, and sells shoes through its online store – www.shoescandal.com.

14. Customers nationwide, including those within this judicial district, can purchase Defendant's shoes via its website - www.shoescandal.com.

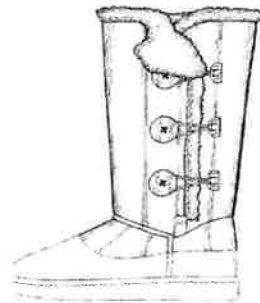
1 15. Defendant has offered and is currently advertising, offering for sale, and

16 16. Deckers has not granted a license or any other form of permission to
17 Defendant with respect to the UGG Designs.

18 **FIRST CLAIM FOR RELIEF**

19 **(Patent Infringement – 35 U.S.C. § 271)**

20 17. Plaintiff incorporates herein by reference the averments of the preceding
21 paragraphs as though fully set forth herein.

22 18. Plaintiff Deckers Outdoor Corporation is the owner by assignment of all
23 right, title and interest in and to the design patents for the UGG Designs.

24 19. Defendant has knowingly and intentionally manufactured, caused to be
25 produced, distributed, advertised, marketed, offered for sale, and/or sold footwear that
26 is nearly identical to the UGG Designs in direct violation of 35 U.S.C. § 271.

27 20. Defendant’s use of the UGG Designs is without Plaintiff’s permission or
28 authority and is in total disregard of Plaintiff’s right to control its intellectual property.

1 21. As a direct and proximate result of Defendant's infringing conduct,
2 Plaintiff has been injured and will continue to suffer injury to its business and
3 reputation unless Defendant is restrained by this Court from infringing Plaintiff's
4 design patents.

5 22. Defendant's acts have damaged and will continue to damage Plaintiff, and
6 Plaintiff has no adequate remedy at law.

7 23. On information and belief, Defendant's acts herein complained of
8 constitute willful acts and intentional infringement of the UGG Designs.

9 24. In light of the foregoing, Plaintiff is entitled to injunctive relief
10 prohibiting Defendant from using the UGG Designs and to recover from Defendant all
11 damages, including attorneys' fees, that Plaintiff has sustained and will sustain as a
12 result of such infringing acts, and all gains, profits and advantages obtained by
13 Defendant as a result thereof, in an amount to be determined, which amount can be
14 trebled under 35 U.S.C. § 284.

15 **SECOND CLAIM FOR RELIEF**

16 **Unfair Competition Under California Common Law**

17 25. Plaintiff incorporates herein by reference the averments of the preceding
18 paragraphs as though fully set forth herein.

19 26. Defendant's infringement of Plaintiff's UGG Designs constitutes unfair
20 competition in violation of the common law of the State of California.

21 27. Plaintiff has no adequate remedy at law to compensate it fully for the
22 damages that have been caused and which will continue to be caused by Defendant's
23 infringing conduct, unless it is enjoined by this Court.

24 28. In light of the foregoing, Plaintiff is entitled to injunctive relief
25 prohibiting Defendant from using the UGG Designs, and to recover all damages,
26 including attorneys' fees, that Plaintiff has sustained and will sustain, and all gains,
27 profits and advantages obtained by Defendant as a result of its infringing acts alleged
28 above in an amount not yet known, and the costs of this action.

1 29. The conduct herein complained of was extreme, outrageous, fraudulent,
2 and was inflicted on Plaintiff in reckless disregard of Plaintiff's rights. Said conduct
3 was despicable and harmful to Plaintiff and as such supports an award of exemplary
4 and punitive damages in an amount sufficient to punish and make an example of
5 Defendant, and to deter it from similar such conduct in the future.

6 **PRAYER FOR RELIEF**

7 WHEREFORE, Plaintiff respectfully prays for judgment against Defendant, as
8 follows:

- 9 1. A Judgment that Defendant has infringed the UGG Designs
10 in violation of 35 U.S.C. § 271 and that Defendant's infringement was willful;
- 11 2. An order granting temporary, preliminary and permanent injunctive relief
12 restraining and enjoining Defendant, its officers, agents, employees, and attorneys, and
13 all those persons or entities in active concert or participation with them from:
- 14 (a) manufacturing, importing, advertising, marketing, promoting,
15 supplying, distributing, offering for sale, or selling any products that infringe upon the
16 UGG Designs, including the Infringing Products;
- 17 (b) engaging in any other activity constituting unfair competition with
18 Plaintiff, or acts and practices that deceive consumers, the public, and/or trade,
19 including without limitation, the use of designations and design elements used or
20 owned by or associated with Plaintiff; and
- 21 (c) committing any other act which falsely represents or which has the
22 effect of falsely representing that the goods and services of Defendant are licensed by,
23 authorized by, offered by, produced by, sponsored by, or in any other way associated
24 with Plaintiff;
- 25 3. Ordering Defendant to recall from any distributors and retailers and to
26 deliver to Plaintiff for destruction or other disposition all remaining inventory of all
27 Infringing Products and related items, including all advertisements, promotional and
28 marketing materials therefore, as well as means of making same;

- 1 4. Ordering Defendant to file with this Court and serve on Plaintiff within
2 thirty (30) days after entry of the injunction a report in writing, under oath setting forth
3 in detail the manner and form in which Defendant has complied with the injunction;
- 4 5. Ordering an accounting by Defendant of all gains, profits and advantages
5 derived from their wrongful acts;
- 6 6. Awarding Plaintiff all of Defendant's profits and all damages sustained by
7 Plaintiff as a result of Defendant's wrongful acts, and such other compensatory
8 damages as the Court determines to be fair and appropriate;
- 9 7. Increasing the damages up to three times the amount found or assessed
10 under 35 U.S.C. § 284;
- 11 8. Awarding applicable interest, costs, disbursements and attorneys' fees;
- 12 9. Finding that this is an exceptional case under 35 U.S.C. § 285 and
13 awarding attorneys' fees thereunder;
- 14 10. Awarding Plaintiff's punitive damages in connection with its claims under
15 California law; and
- 16 11. Such other relief as may be just and proper.

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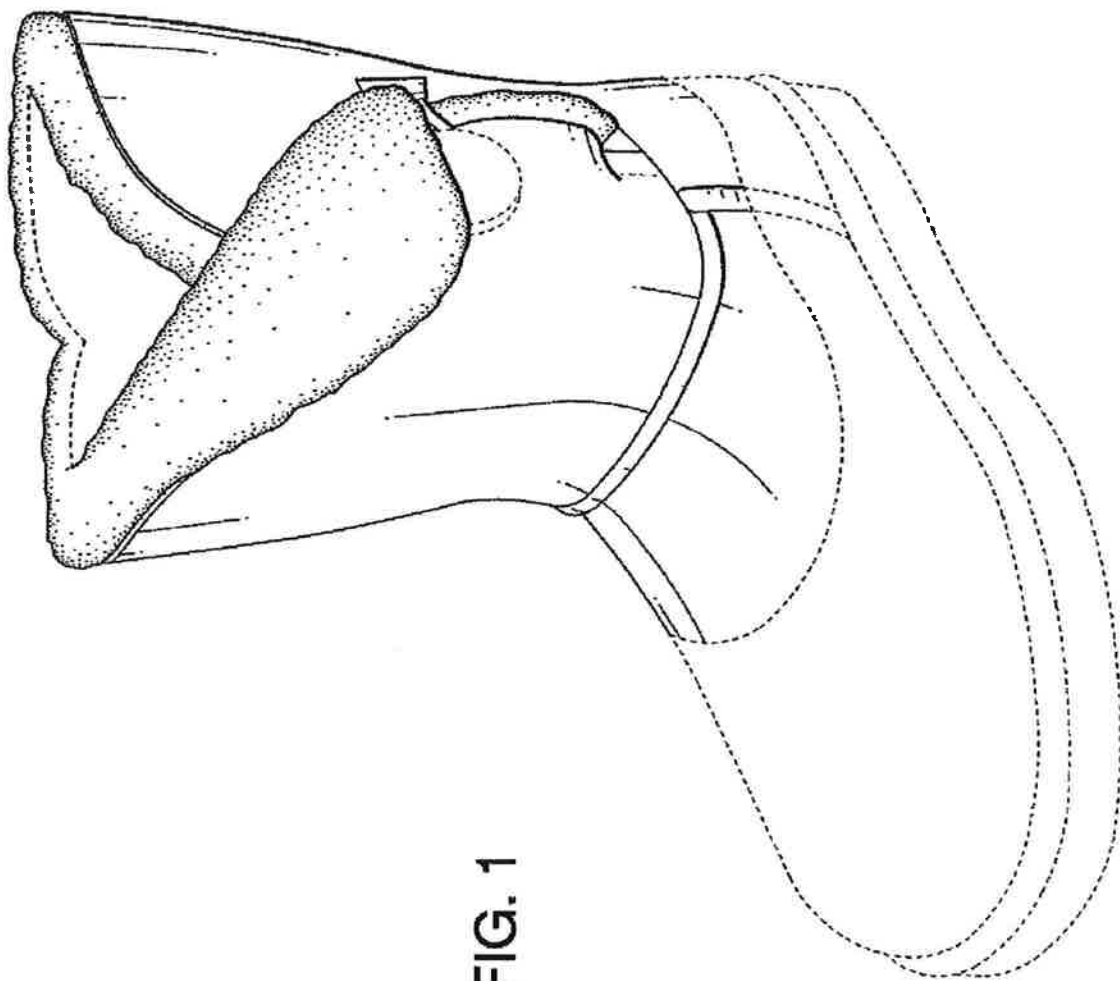

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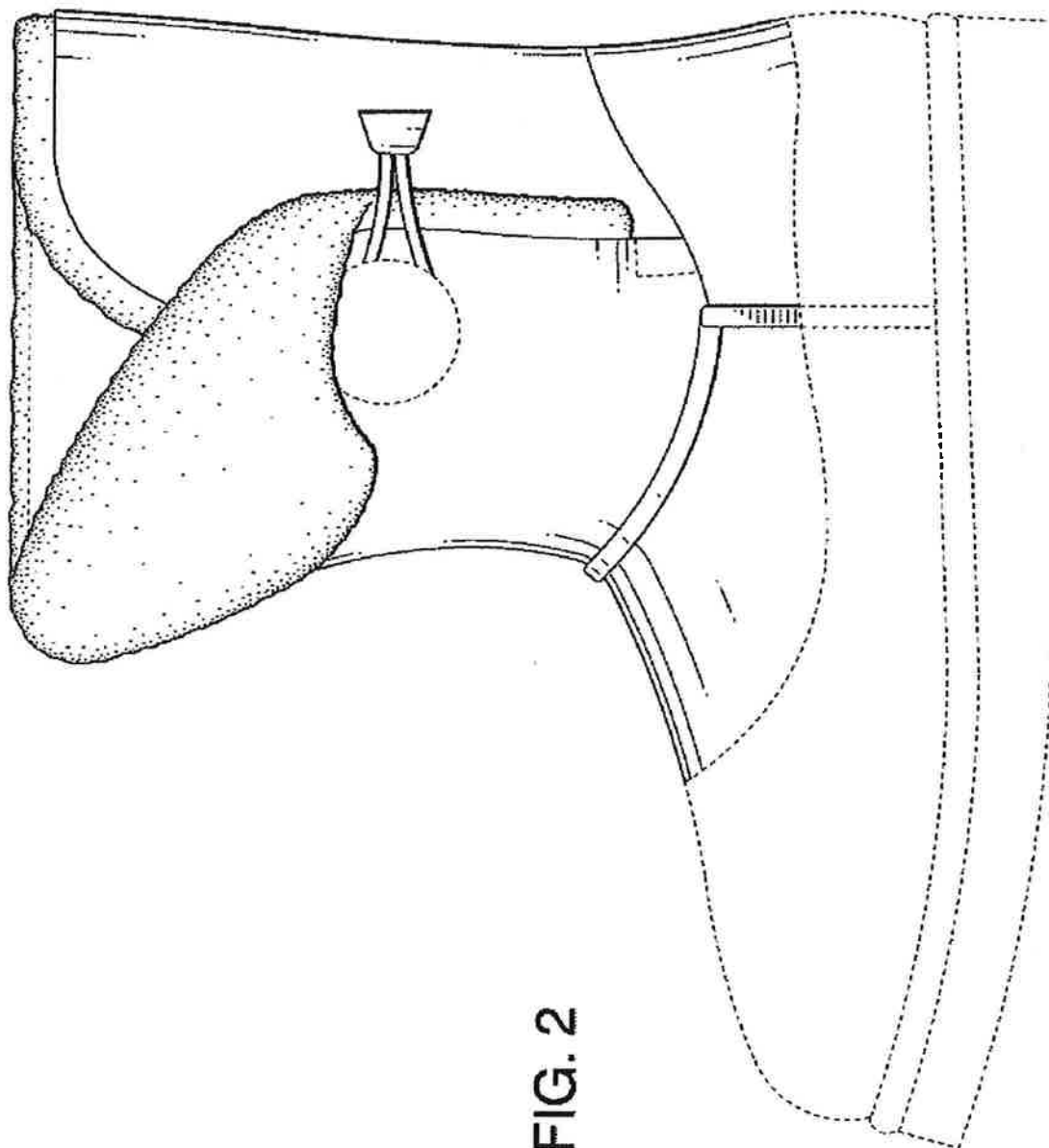


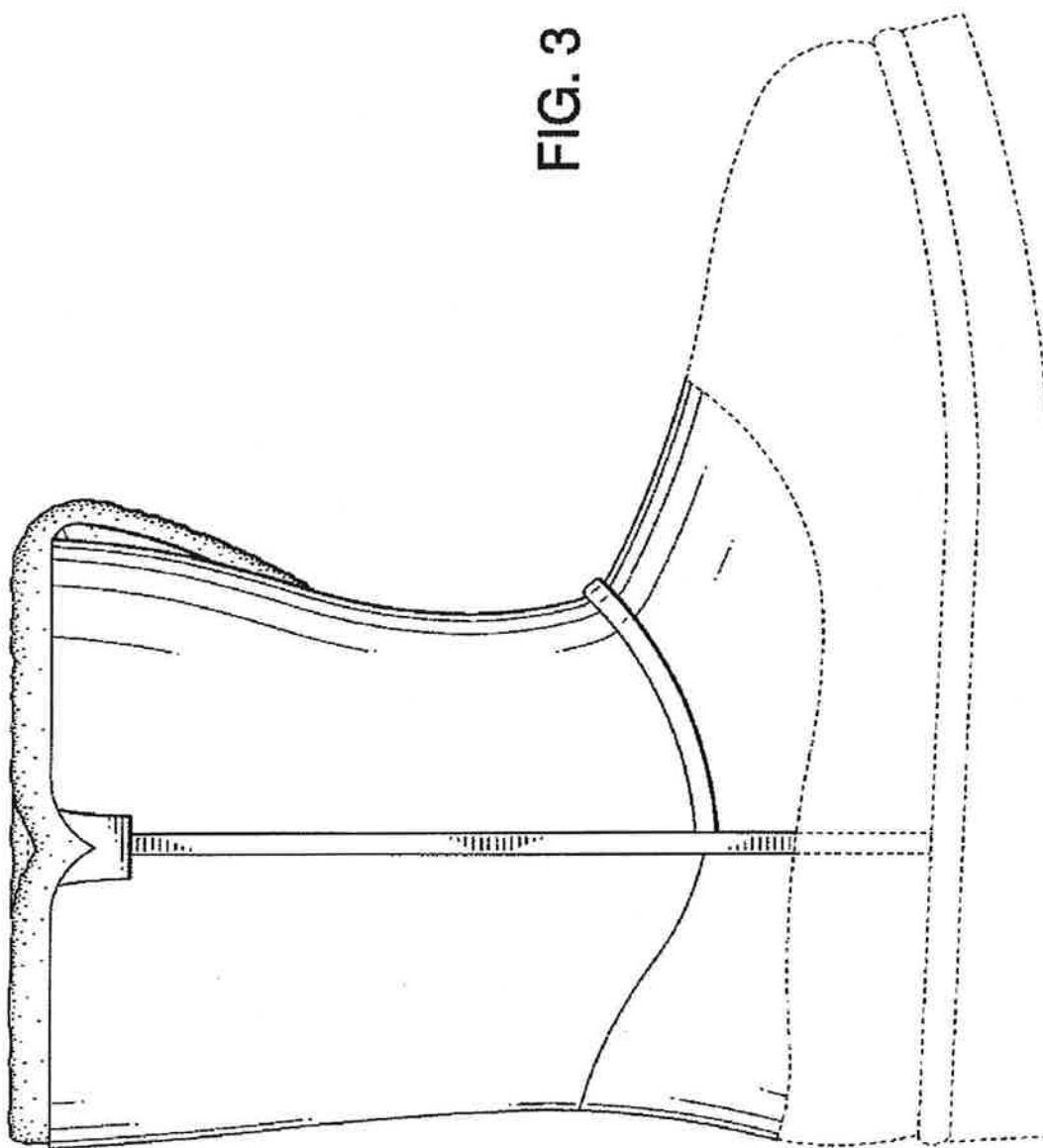

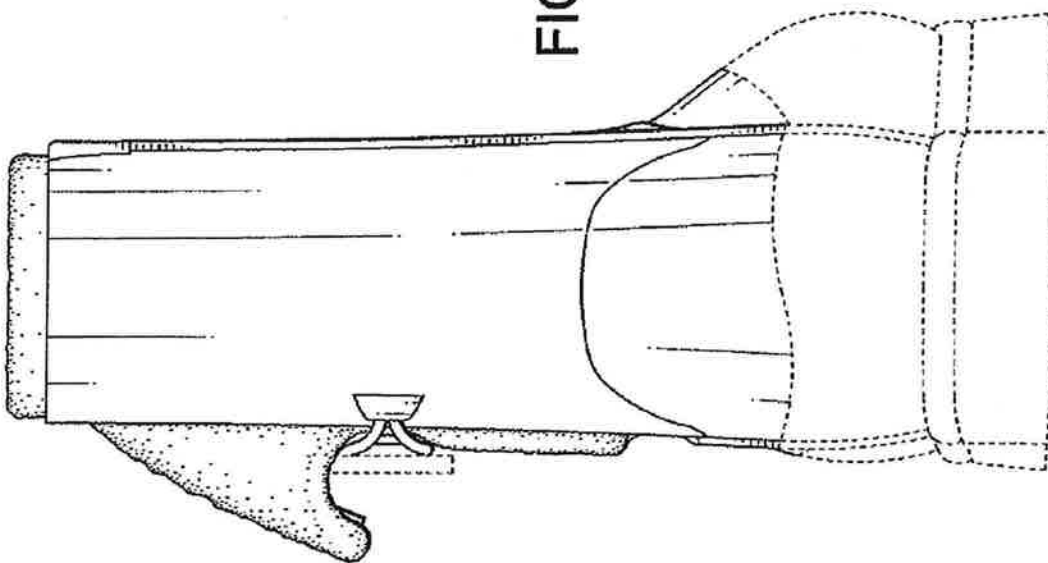
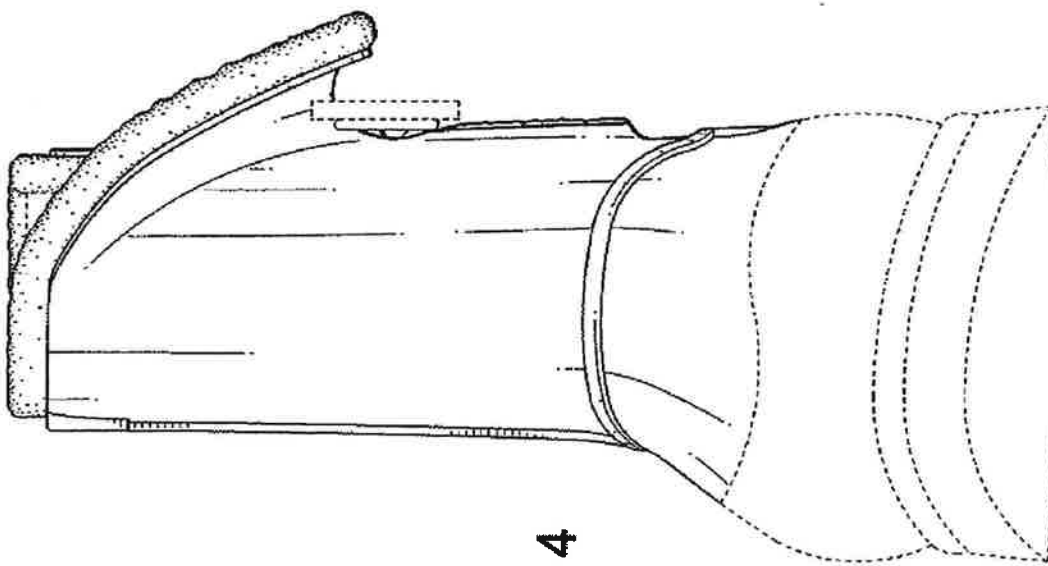

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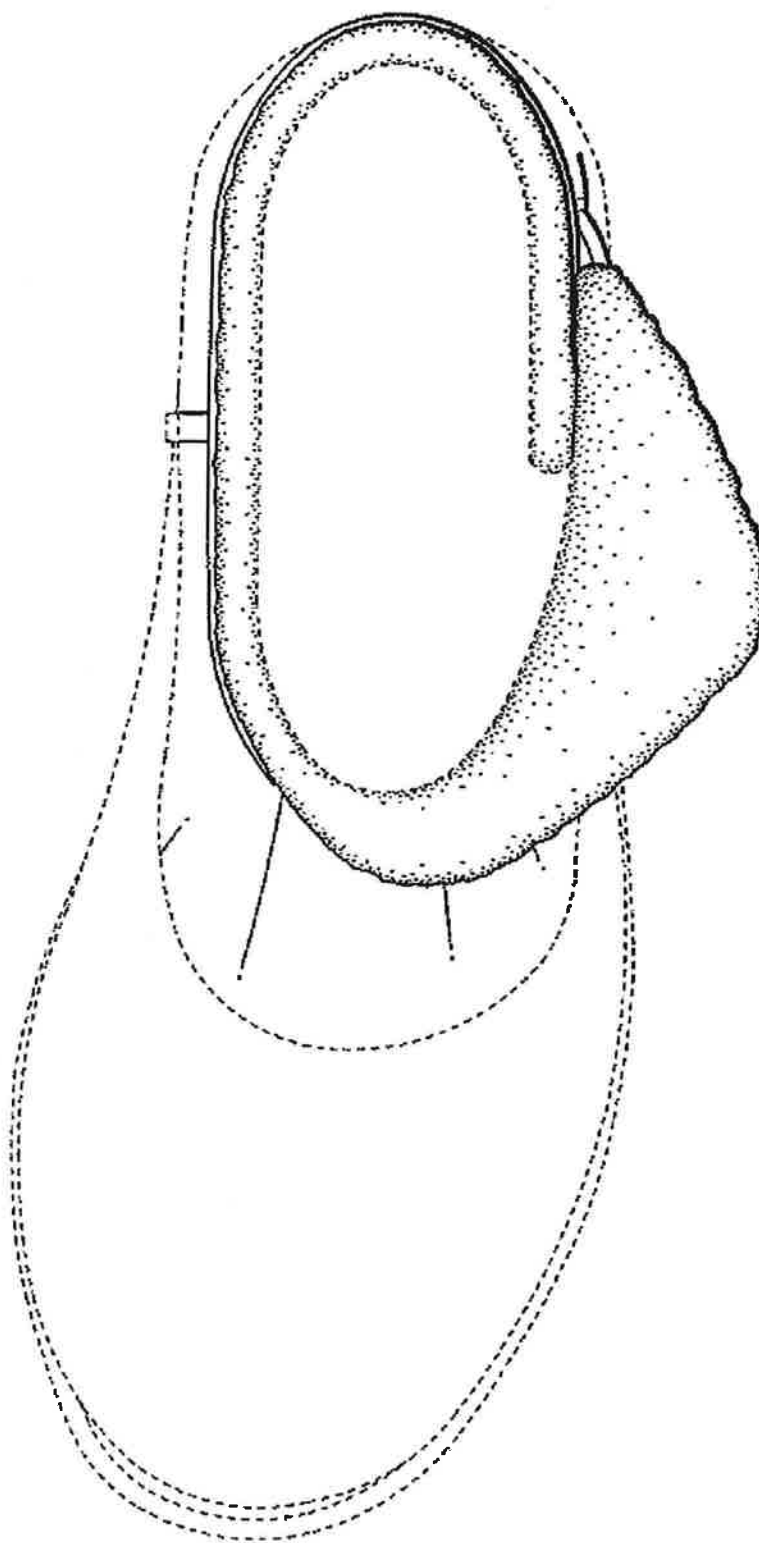

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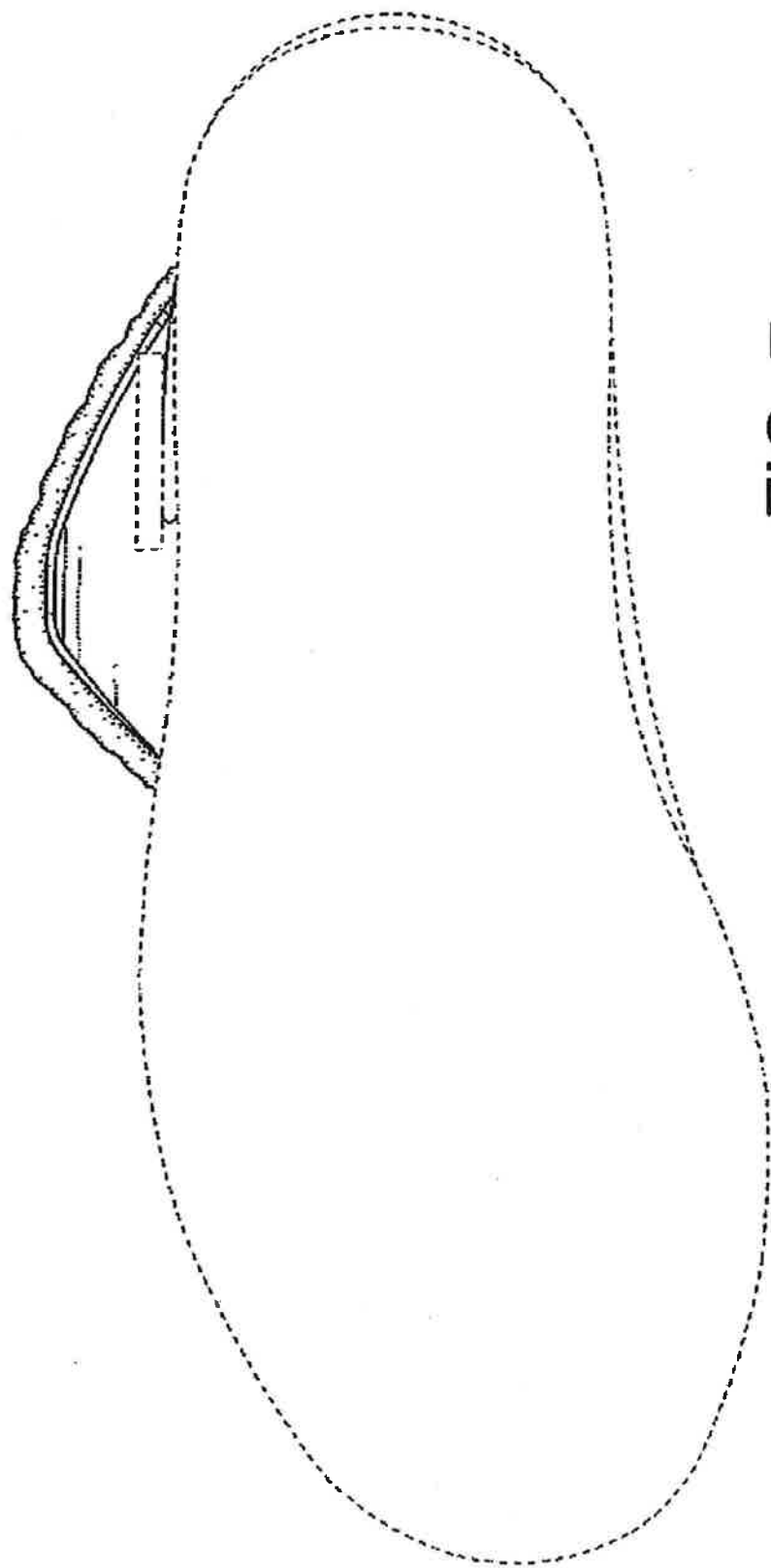

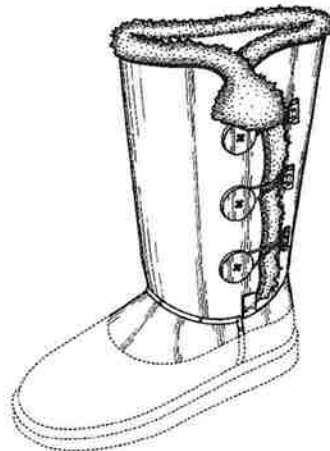

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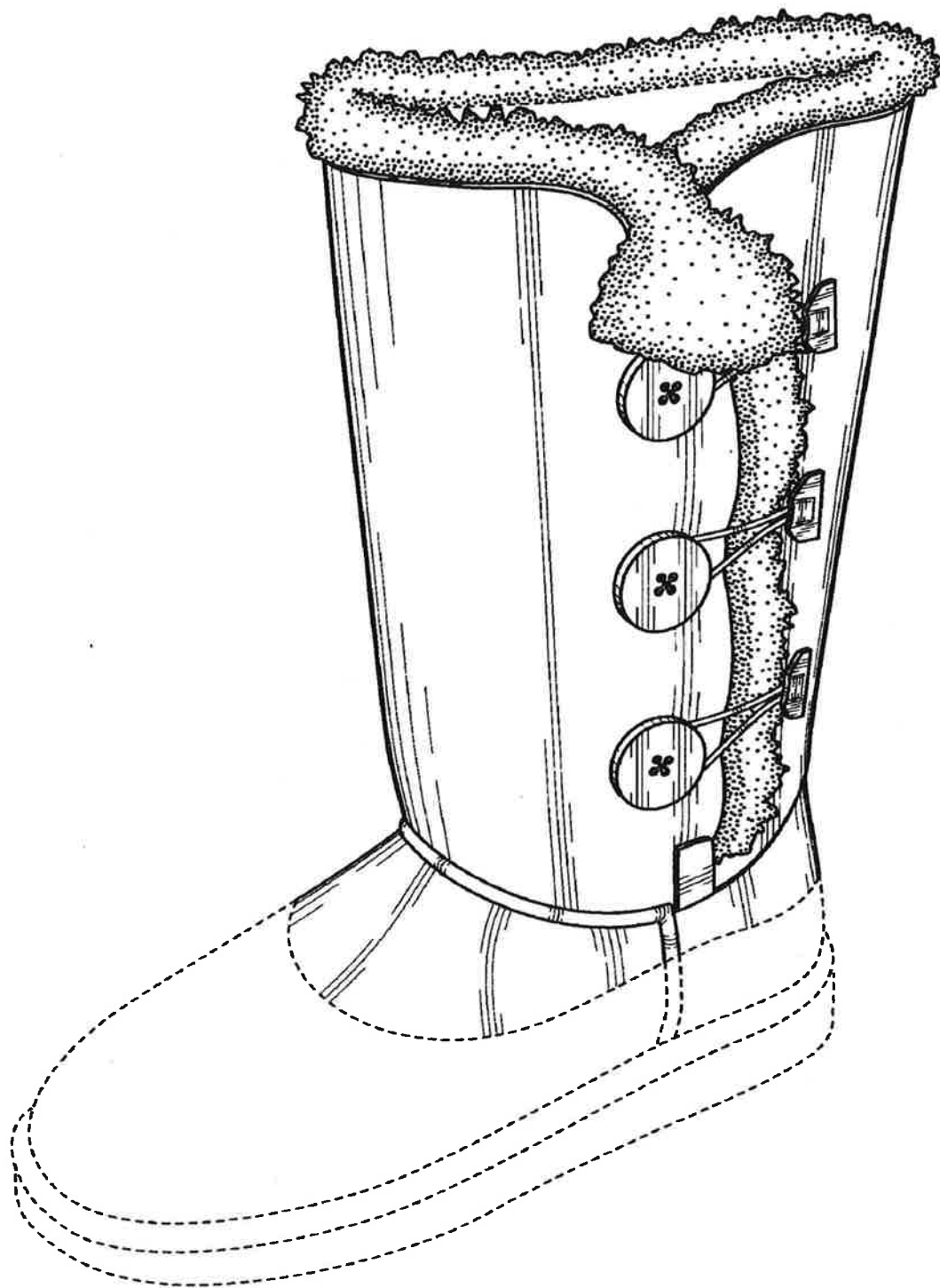

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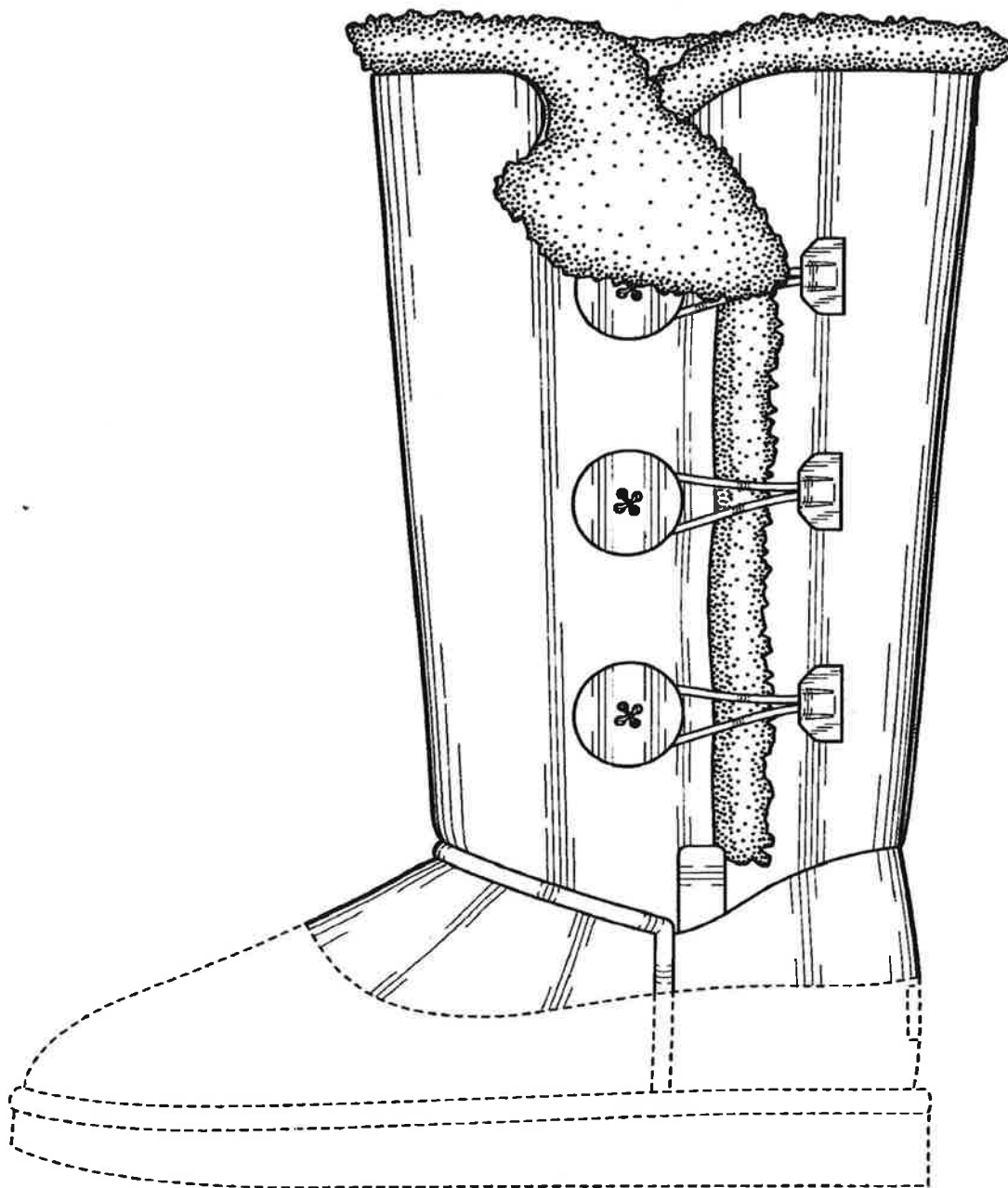

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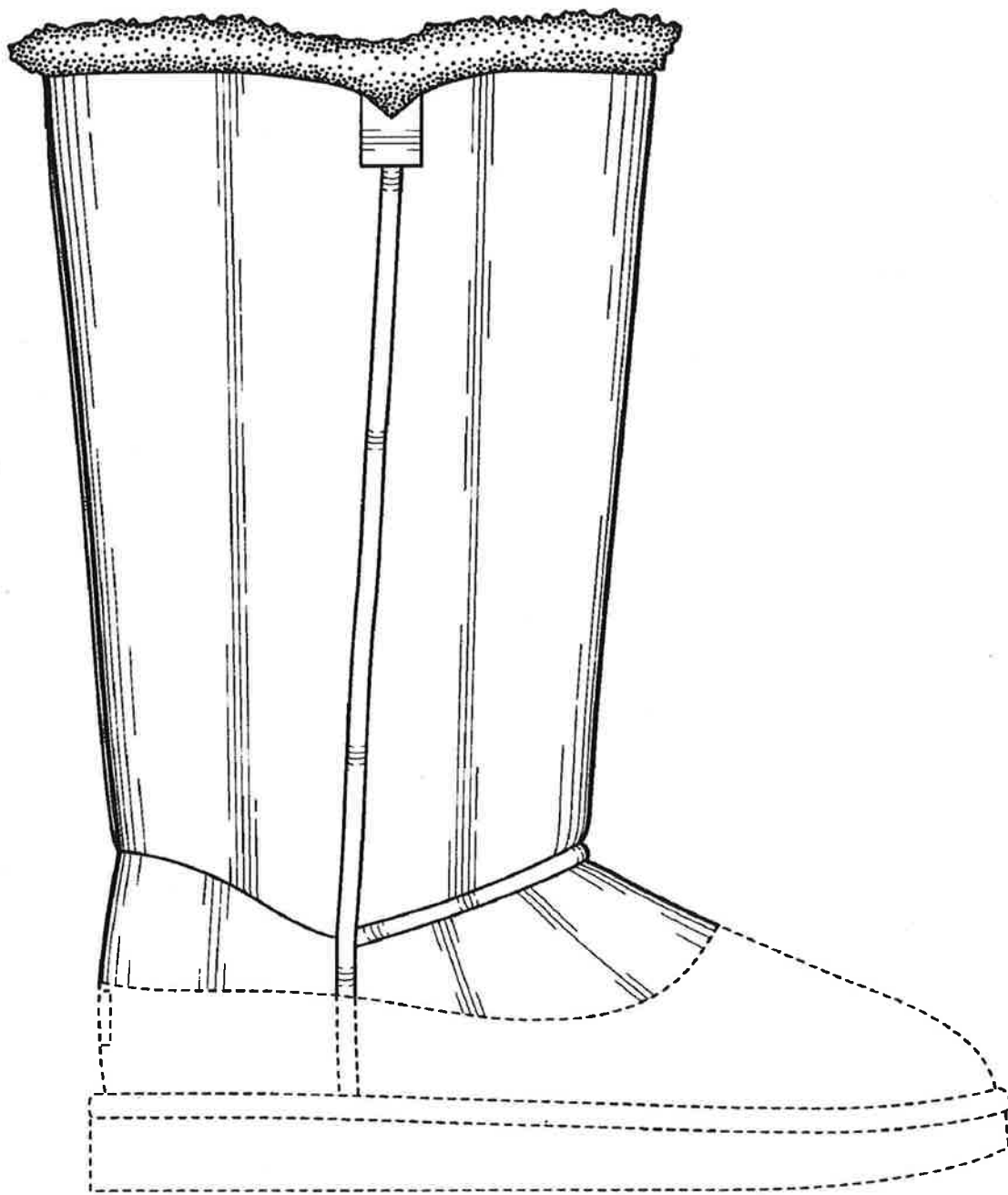

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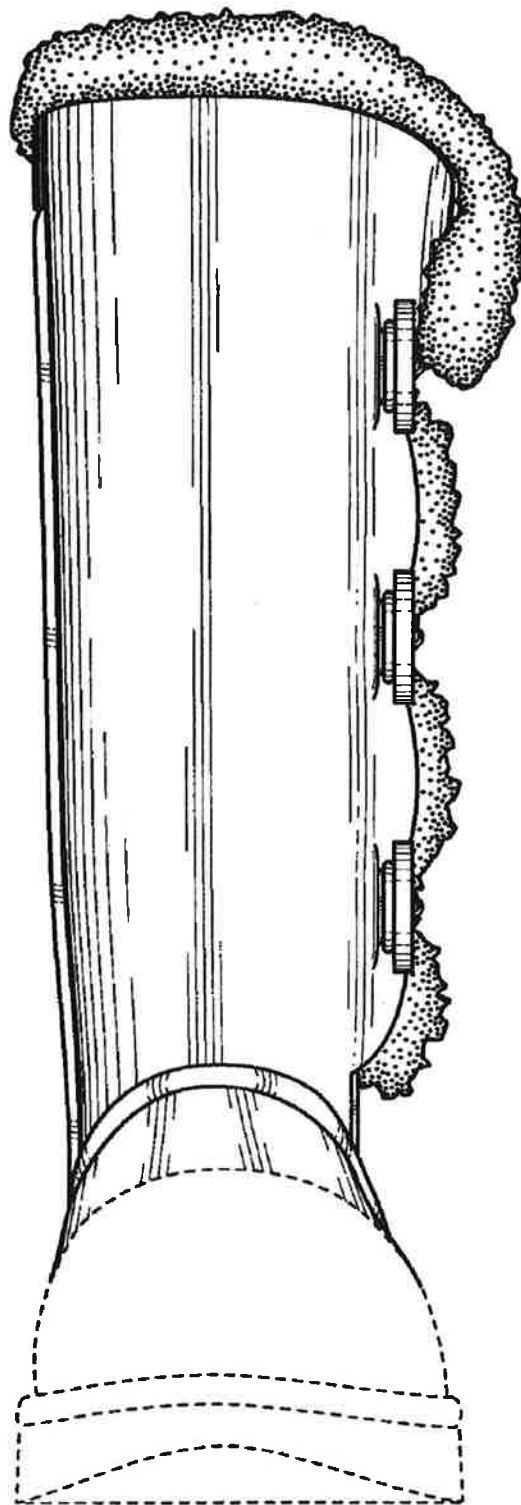

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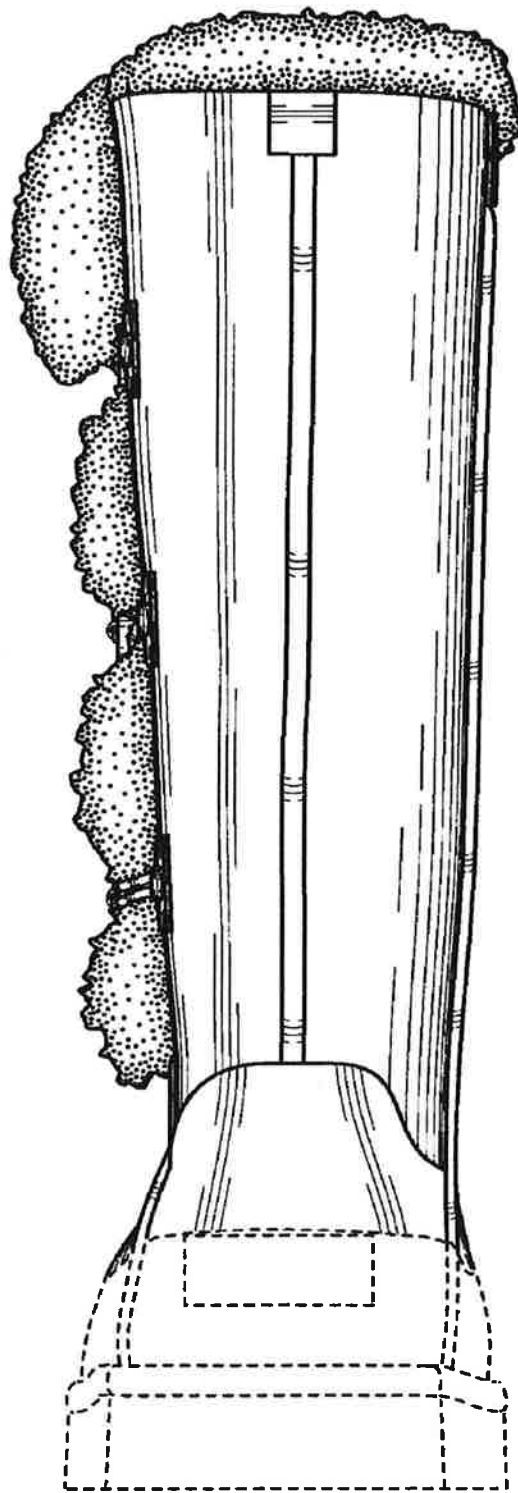

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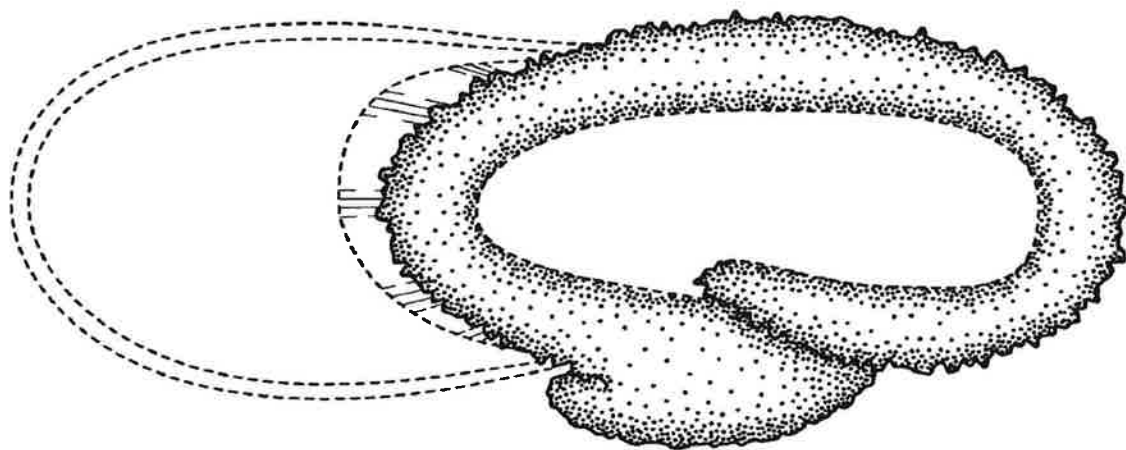
