PARTIES

- 2. DexCom is a Delaware corporation with its principal place of business in San Diego, California.
- 3. Upon information and belief, My Health is a Delaware corporation with offices in Plano, Texas. Upon information and belief, My Health has an agent for service of process in Carlsbad, California.

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

- This is an action under the Federal Declaratory Judgment Act, 28 4. U.S.C. §§ 2201 and 2202, against My Health for a declaration that pursuant to the patent laws of the United States, 35 U.S.C. §§ 1 et seq., the claims of the '985 patent are not infringed by DexCom. Jurisdiction as to these claims is conferred on this Court by 28 U.S.C. §§ 1331 and 1338 (a).
- Upon information and belief, this Court has personal jurisdiction over 5. My Health by virtue of its contacts with this forum. My Health's web site represents that the company maintains an office in Silicon Valley, located at 1733 Woodside Road, Suite 300, Redwood City, California 94061. My Health's web site also identifies just two corporate officers. On information and belief, both of My Health's corporate officers reside and work in the State of California. Upon information and belief, Michael Edward Eiffert, President of My Health, resides in Thousand Oaks, California. Upon information and belief, Vincent F. Aiello, My Health's Chief Financial Officer and General Counsel, maintains a legal office at 5620 Paseo Del Norte in Carlsbad, California, and is a current resident of Carlsbad, California. Mr. Aiello was served with both the Summons and Complaint in his capacity as a corporate officer of My Health at his residence in Carlsbad, California on April 28, 2015, the same day the Complaint was filed. Upon information and belief, both Mr. Eiffert and Mr. Aiello conduct and/or direct My Health's business, licensing and litigation activities from their homes and offices in California. My Health also has attempted to license the '985 patent in this District.

1	6. Venue is proper in this District under 28 U.S.C. §§ 1391 and 1400(b).
2	My Health does business in this District and a substantial part of DexCom's claims
3	arise in this District. Among other things, My Health has attempted to license the
4	'985 patent in this District.
5	THE PATENT-IN-SUIT
6	7. The United States Patent and Trademark Office ("PTO") issued the
7	'985 patent, entitled Method and System for Monitoring and Treating a Patient, on
8	September 2, 2003. A true and correct copy of the '985 patent is attached as
9	Exhibit A.
10	8. The named inventors of the '985 patent are Michael E. Eiffert and Lisa
11	C. Schwartz. The named assignee of the '985 patent is the University of Rochester.
12	9. Upon information and belief, the current assignee of the '985 patent is
13	My Health.
14	10. Upon information and belief, My Health is a patent holding company
15	that does not compete with DexCom. Upon information and belief, My Health
16	does not make or sell any products or services itself.

18	11. Upon information and belief, My Health has brought suit against at
19	least twenty-four different parties for patent infringement of the '985 patent

PATENT

13. On April 16, 2015, the Patent Licensing Alliance ("PLA"), acting as the licensing agent of My Health, sent a letter ("the April 16 Letter") to DexCom

asserting that the DexCom G4 System employs the technology claimed and disclosed in the '985 patent. A true and correct copy of the April 16 Letter is attached as Exhibit B. Specifically, the letter stated that DexCom's "G4 System employs the technology claimed and disclosed in" the '985 Patent. The letter also reported that PLA's "research group and legal team have thoroughly reviewed the Dexcom G4 System and believe that it utilizes the technology claimed and disclosed in the" '985 patent. (Ex. B at 1 (emphasis added).)

- 14. In the April 16 Letter, My Health, through its agent PLA, stated that it had been a licensee of the '985 patent since 2008 and was assigned the patent in 2015. (*Id.*) The letter further stated that "My Health has been enforcing its intellectual property rights" in the '985 patent due in part to "ever-increasing instances of improper use without a license." (*Id.*)
- 15. In the April 16 Letter, My Health, through its agent PLA, asserted that "[t]he Patent requires a license if [DexCom] intend[s] to continue to sell these products." The letter then cited and quoted the entirety of the statutory tests for direct and induced infringement, 35 U.S.C. § 271(a) and (b). (*Id.*) The letter also contained several attachments, including a two-page "Notice" purportedly describing the subject matter of the patent addressed to DexCom's CEO, Kevin Sayer, with a "re:" line reading "Infringement of U.S. Patent No. 6,612,985." (*Id.* at 3-4 (emphasis added).) The letter also attached a 5-page claim chart titled "Prefiling Investigation Claim Chart" purporting to detail how the DexCom G4 System allegedly meets every limitation of Claim 1 of the '985 patent (*id.* at 31-35), as well as 31 pages of exhibits which My Health alleges, through its agent PLA, supports its infringement claim. ¹ (*Id.* at 36-67.)

Although the Pre-Filing Claim Chart bears a heading that it is "Subject to Confidentiality Agreement," no such agreement between PLA/My Health and DexCom exists. The Pre-Filing Claim Chart also is marked as "Rule 408 Confidential Communications," but DexCom attaches it here to support the Court's subject matter jurisdiction; it is not offered to establish liability. *See* Fed. R. Evid. 408(b).

16. By virtue of PLA/My Health's correspondence with DexCom and the
numerous patent infringement actions filed by My Health over the past three years
My Health has created a reasonable apprehension and substantial likelihood that
DexCom will be sued by My Health for infringement of the '985 patent unless
DexCom pays and agrees to enter into a license agreement with My Health.

17. An actual and justiciable controversy exists between the parties concerning DexCom's liability for the alleged infringement of the claims of the '985 patent. DexCom now seeks a declaratory judgment of non-infringement as to the claims of the '985 patent.

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

(Declaratory Judgment of Non-infringement of the '985 Patent)

- 18. DexCom repeats and realleges paragraphs 1-17 of this Complaint as if fully set forth herein.
- 19. My Health claims to be the owner and assignee of all rights, title, and interest in and under the '985 patent.
- 20. My Health communicated to DexCom that it has the right to assert the '985 patent, that DexCom's G4 System utilizes the technology claimed and disclosed in the '985 patent and that DexCom must obtain a license under the '985 patent if it intended to continue to sell its products.
- 21. As a result of My Health's allegations against DexCom and in light of My Health's litigious history, an actual controversy exists as to the infringement of the claims of the '985 patent.
- 22. DexCom does not and has not infringed any valid and enforceable claim of the '985 patent, whether directly or indirectly, by inducement or contributory infringement, literally or under the doctrine of equivalents.
- 23. A judicial determination of non-infringement is necessary and appropriate so that DexCom may ascertain its rights regarding the '985 patent.

1	PRAYER FOR RELIEF
2	WHEREFORE, DexCom prays that the Court enter judgment in its favor and
3	against My Health as follows:
4	1. A declaration that DexCom does not and has not infringed any valid
5	and enforceable claim of the '985 patent;
6	2. A determination that this is an exceptional case within the meaning of
7	35 U.S.C. § 285; and
8	3. Such further relief as the Court may deem just and proper.
9	DEMAND FOR JURY TRIAL
10	DexCom hereby demands a jury trial on all issues so triable
11
