Plaintiff, SPLIT THE SHEETS, LLC ("Plaintiff"), for its Complaint against the Defendants, HILDA DILBECK ("Defendant"), avers that:

STATEMENT OF JURISDICTION AND VENUE

- 1. This is an action for declaratory judgment arising under the United States Patent Laws, 35 U.S.C. §271, et seq. Plaintiff seeks a declaration that United States Patent No. 379,893 is not infringed, and is invalid and/or unenforceable. This Court has jurisdiction pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§1331, 1338, 2201 and 2202.
 - 2. Venue is proper in this judicial district pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §1391.

- 3. Plaintiff Split The Sheets, LLC, is a Washington corporation having its principal place of business at 1432 N. Woodlawn Street, Tacoma, WA 98406.
 - 4. Split The Sheets, is a leading developer and marketer of innovative bed coverings.
- 5. Upon information and belief, Defendant Hilda Dilbeck is an Oklahoma resident with an address of Box 44, Ratliff City, OK 73081. All acts of Hilda Dilbeck as alleged herein were done for the benefit of her marital community, which includes "John Doe" Dilbeck.
- 5. United States Patent No. 379,893 ('893 patent) entitled "UNITARY HALF SHEET HALF BLANKET", was issued on June 17, 1997, and names Hilda Dilbeck as inventor. A copy of the '893 patent is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

FIRST CLAIM FOR RELIEF

(Patent Non-Infringement)

- 6. Plaintiff incorporates by this reference each and every averment contained in Paragraphs 1 through 6 of this Complaint as though fully set forth in this claim for relief.
- 7. Defendants have asserted by letter that the '893 patent has been infringed by Split the Sheets' manufacture and sale of Split the Sheets' bed coverings. The letter is attached hereto as Exhibit B.
- 8. Plaintiff has not and is not now infringing any of the claims of the '893 patent because the bed coverings sold by Plaintiff are not encompassed within the scope of any claim of the '893 patent.
- 9. By virtue of the matters alleged in the foregoing paragraphs of this Complaint, a justiciable controversy with respect to the infringement and validity of the '893 patent has arisen and does now exist between Plaintiff and Defendants.

SECOND CLAIM FOR RELIEF

(Patent Invalid and Unenforceable)

- 10. Plaintiff incorporates by this reference each and every averment contained in paragraphs I through II of this complaint as though fully set forth in this claim for relief.
- 12.4. The '893 patent and each and every claim thereof is invalid and unenforceable for one or more of the following reasons:
 - (a) the '893 patent is invalid and unenforceable for lack of novelty or loss of right to patent under 35 U.S.C. §102;
 - (b) the '893 patent is invalid and unenforceable under 35 U.S.C. § 103 because there is little, if any, difference between the subject matter of the patent and the prior art, and such subject matter as a whole would have been obvious to a person having ordinary skill in the art to which said subject matter pertains at the time the alleged invention was made;
 - (c) the '893 patent is invalid and unenforceable under 35 U.S.C. § 112 because it lacks an enabling disclosure and fails to particularly point out and distinctly claim the subject matter the inventor regards as his invention.

RELIEF SOUGHT

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff requests the entry of a final judgment:

- (a) Declaring that United States Patent No. Des. 379,893 has not been infringed by Plaintiff;
- (b) Declaring that United States Patent No. Des. 379,893 is invalid and unenforceable.
- (c) Awarding to Plaintiff its taxable costs, its expenses and its reasonable attorneys' fees incurred in connection with the prosecution of this action; and
 - (d) Granting such other and further relief as this Court may deem just and proper.
