COMPLAINT FOR PATENT INFRINGEMENT

1. Plaintiff Cedar Lane Technologies Inc. ("Plaintiff"), through its attorneys, complains of Verizon Communications Inc. ("Defendant"), and alleges the following:

PARTIES

- 2. Plaintiff Cedar Lane Technologies Inc. is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of Canada that maintains its principal place of business at 560 Baker Street, Suite 1, Nelson, BC V1L 4H9.
- 3. Defendant Verizon Communications Inc. is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of Delaware that maintains an established place of business at 2812 W Loop 340, Suite # H-12, Waco, TX, 76711.

JURISDICTION

4. This is an action for patent infringement arising under the patent laws of the United States, Title 35 of the United States Code.

- 5. This Court has exclusive subject matter jurisdiction under 28 U.S.C. §§ 1331 and 1338(a).
- 6. This Court has personal jurisdiction over Defendant because it has engaged in systematic and continuous business activities in this District. As described below, Defendant has committed acts of patent infringement giving rise to this action within this District.

VENUE

7. Venue is proper in this District under 28 U.S.C. § 1400(b) because Defendant has an established place of business in this District. In addition, Defendant has committed acts of patent infringement in this District, and Plaintiff has suffered harm in this district.

PATENTS-IN-SUIT

8. Plaintiff is the assignee of all right, title and interest in United States Patent Nos. 6,629,077; 6,721,489; 7,086,079; and 8,165,867 (the "Patents-in-Suit"); including all rights to enforce and prosecute actions for infringement and to collect damages for all relevant times against infringers of the Patents-in-Suit. Accordingly, Plaintiff possesses the exclusive right and standing to prosecute the present action for infringement of the Patents-in-Suit by Defendant.

THE '077 PATENT

9. The '077 Patent is entitled "Universal remote control adapted to receive voice input," and issued 2003-09-30. The application leading to the '077 Patent was filed on 2000-11-22. A true and correct copy of the '077 Patent is attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated herein by reference.

THE '489 PATENT

10. The '489 Patent is entitled "Play list manager," and issued 2004-04-13. The application leading to the '489 Patent was filed on 2000-03-08. A true and correct copy of the '489 Patent is attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by reference.

THE '079 PATENT

11. The '079 Patent is entitled "Method and apparatus for internet TV," and issued 2006-08-01. The application leading to the '079 Patent was filed on 2000-11-21. A true and correct copy of the '079 Patent is attached hereto as Exhibit 3 and incorporated herein by reference.

THE '867 PATENT

12. The '867 Patent is entitled "Methods for translating a device command," and issued 2012-04-24. The application leading to the '867 Patent was filed on 2000-09-15. A true and correct copy of the '867 Patent is attached hereto as Exhibit 4 and incorporated herein by reference.

- 15. Defendant also directly infringed, literally or under the doctrine of equivalents, the Exemplary '077 Patent Claims, by having its employees internally test and use these Exemplary Products.

43. Under Rule 38(b) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, Plaintiff respectfully requests a trial by jury on all issues so triable.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff respectfully requests the following relief:

- A. A judgment that the '077 Patent is valid and enforceable
- A judgment that Defendant has infringed directly one or more claims of the '077
 Patent;
- C. A judgment that the '489 Patent is valid and enforceable

- D. A judgment that Defendant has infringed directly one or more claims of the '489
 Patent;
- E. A judgment that the '079 Patent is valid and enforceable
- F. A judgment that Defendant has infringed directly and indirectly one or more claims of the '079 Patent;
- G. A judgment that the '867 Patent is valid and enforceable
- H. A judgment that Defendant has infringed directly and indirectly one or more claims of the '867 Patent;
- I. An accounting of all damages not presented at trial;
- J. A judgment that awards Plaintiff all appropriate damages under 35 U.S.C. § 284 for Defendant's continuing or future infringement, up until the date such judgment is entered with respect to the '079; and '867 Patents, including pre- or post-judgment interest, costs, and disbursements as justified under 35 U.S.C. § 284;
- K. A judgment that awards Plaintiff all appropriate damages under 35 U.S.C. § 284 for Defendant's past infringement at least with respect to the '077; and '489 Patents.
- L. And, if necessary, to adequately compensate Plaintiff for Defendant's infringement, an accounting:
 - i. that this case be declared exceptional within the meaning of 35 U.S.C. § 285 and that Plaintiff be awarded its reasonable attorneys fees against Defendant that it incurs in prosecuting this action;
 - ii. that Plaintiff be awarded costs, and expenses that it incurs in prosecuting this action; and

iii. that Plaintiff be awarded such further relief at law or in equity as the Court deems just and proper.
