DEMAND FOR JURY TRIAL

15 Plaintiff, Millennium, L.P., a limited partnership (hereinafter referred to as "Millennium"),
16 demands a jury trial and complains against the defendant as follows:

17 THE PARTIES

18 1. Millennium is a limited partnership organized and existing under the laws of the
19 Cayman Islands, with its principal place of business at P.O. Box 500, Georgetown, Grand Cayman,
20 Cayman Islands.

21 2. Upon information and belief, Defendant Hyland Software, Inc. ("Hyland") is a
22 corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Ohio, having a place of business at
23 28500 Clemens Road, Westlake, OH 44145.

24 JURISDICTION AND VENUE

25 3. This action arises under the patent laws of the United States of America, Title 35 of
26 the United States Code. This Court has jurisdiction of this action under 28 U.S.C. §§ 1331 and
27 1338(a).

12 **PRAYER FOR RELIEF**

13 WHEREFORE, THE Plaintiff, Millennium prays for judgment against the Defendant
14 Hyland on all the counts and for the following relief:

- 16 A. Declaration that the Plaintiff is the owner of the '855 patent, and that the Plaintiff has
17 the right to sue and to recover for infringement thereof;
 - 18 B. Declaration that the '855 patent is valid and enforceable;
 - 19 C. Declaration that the Defendant has infringed, actively induced infringement of, and
20 contributorily infringed '855 patent;
 - 21 D. Declaration that the Plaintiff is the owner of the '508 patent, and that the Plaintiff has
22 the right to sue and to recover for infringement thereof;
 - 23 E. Declaration that the '508 patent is valid and enforceable;
 - 24 F. Declaration that the Defendant has infringed, actively induced infringement of, and
25 contributorily infringed '508 patent;
 - 26 G. Declaration that the Plaintiff is the owner of the '465 patent, and that the Plaintiff has
27 the right to sue and to recover for infringement thereof;
 - 28 H. Declaration that the '465 patent is valid and enforceable;

- 1 I. Declaration that the Defendant has infringed, actively induced infringement of, and
2 contributorily infringed '465 patent;
- 3 J. Declaration that the Plaintiff is the owner of the '506 patent, and that the Plaintiff has
4 the right to sue and to recover for infringement thereof;
- 5 K. Declaration that the '506 patent is valid and enforceable;
- 6 L. Declaration that the Defendant has infringed, actively induced infringement of, and
7 contributorily infringed '506 patent;
- 8 M. Declaration that the Plaintiff is the owner of the '505 patent, and that the Plaintiff has
9 the right to sue and to recover for infringement thereof;
- 10 N. Declaration that the '505 patent is valid and enforceable;
- 11 O. Declaration that the Defendant has infringed, actively induced infringement of, and
12 contributorily infringed '505 patent;
- 13 P. A preliminary and permanent injunction against the Defendant, each of its officers,
14 agents, servants, employees, and attorneys, all parent and subsidiary corporations,
15 their assigns and successors in interest, and those persons acting in active concert or
16 participation with them, including distributors and customers, enjoining them from
17 continuing acts of infringement, active inducement of infringement, and contributory
18 infringement of Millennium's '855, '508, '465, '506 and '505 patents;
- 19 Q. An accounting for damages under 35 U.S.C. §284 for infringement of Millennium's
20 '855, '508, '465, '506 and '505 patents by the Defendant and the award of damages
21 so ascertained to the Plaintiff, Millennium, together with interest as provided by law;
- 22 R. A judgment that the Defendant is a willful infringer and an award of treble damages
23 to the Plaintiff, Millennium, pursuant to 35 U.S.C. §284 against the Defendant,
24 Hyland;
- 25 S. Award of reasonable attorney's fees to the Plaintiff, Millennium, pursuant to 35
26 U.S.C. §285;
- 27 T. Award of Millennium's costs and expenses; and
