**COMPLAINT FOR PATENT
INFRINGEMENT**

DEMAND FOR JURY TRIAL

Plaintiff, Millennium, L.P., a limited partnership (hereinafter referred to as "Millennium"), demands a jury trial and complains against the defendant as follows:

THE PARTIES

1. Millennium is a limited partnership organized and existing under the laws of the Cayman Islands, with its principal place of business at Clifton House, 75 Fort Street, P.O. Box 190, George Town, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands.

2. Upon information and belief, eCopy, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "Defendant" or "eCopy") is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New Hampshire, having a place of business at One Oracle Drive, Nashua, New Hampshire 03062.

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

3. This action arises under the patent laws of the United States of America, Title 35 of the United States Code. This Court has jurisdiction of this action under 28 U.S.C. §§ 1331 and 1338(a).

1 4. On information and belief, Defendant is doing business and committing
2 infringements in this judicial district and are subject to personal jurisdiction in this judicial district.

3 5. Venue is proper in this judicial district pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1391 and 1400(b).

4 **CLAIM FOR PATENT INFRINGEMENT**

5 6. Plaintiff, Millennium, repeats and incorporates herein the entirety of the allegations
6 contained in paragraphs 1 through 5 above.

7 7. On November 2, 1993, U.S. Patent No. 5,258,855 (hereinafter referred to as “the
8 ‘855 patent”) was duly and legally issued to System X, L.P. for an invention entitled “Information
9 Processing Methodology.” The ‘855 Patent was subsequently assigned to Millennium. A copy of
10 the ‘855 patent is attached to this Complaint as Exhibit 1.

11 8. On November 29, 1994, U.S. Patent No. 5,369,508 (hereinafter referred to as “the
12 ‘508 patent”) was duly and legally issued to System X, L.P. for an invention entitled “Information
13 Processing Methodology.” The ‘508 Patent was subsequently assigned to Millennium. A copy of
14 the ‘508 patent is attached to this Complaint as Exhibit 2.

15 9. On April 29, 1997, U.S. Patent No. 5,625,465 (hereinafter referred to as “the ‘465
16 patent”) was duly and legally issued to International Patent Holdings, Ltd. for an invention entitled
17 “Information Processing Methodology.” The ‘465 Patent was subsequently assigned to Millennium.
18 A copy of the ‘465 patent is attached to this Complaint as Exhibit 3.

19 10. On June 16, 1998, U.S. Patent No. 5,768,416 (hereinafter referred to as “the ‘416
20 patent”) was duly and legally issued to Millennium for an invention entitled “Information
21 Processing Methodology.” A copy of the ‘416 patent is attached to this Complaint as Exhibit 4.

22 11. On July 25, 2000, U.S. Patent No. 6,094,505 (hereinafter referred to as “the ‘505
23 patent”) was duly and legally issued to Millennium for an invention entitled “Information
24 Processing Methodology.” A copy of the ‘505 patent is attached to this Complaint as Exhibit 5.
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1 12. Millennium is the owner of all right, title and interest in and to the '855 patent, the
2 '508 patent, the '465 patent, the 506 patent and the '505 patent.

3 **COUNT ONE**

4 13. Plaintiff, Millennium, repeats and incorporates herein the entirety of the allegations
5 contained in paragraphs 1 through 12 above.

6 14. eCopy has for a long time past and still is infringing, actively inducing the
7 infringement of and contributorily infringing in this judicial district, the '855 patent by, among
8 other things, importing, making, using, offering for sale, and/or selling computer hardware,
9 software and systems, including but not limited to its eCopy Desktop product, in which information
10 from a hard copy document is extracted and transmitted to an application program in a manner
11 defined by the claims of the '855 patent without permission from Millennium and will continue to
12 do so unless enjoined by this Court.

14 15. Plaintiff, Millennium, has been damaged by such infringing activities by the
15 Defendant of the '855 patent and will be irreparably harmed unless such infringing activities are
16 enjoined by this Court.

17 **COUNT TWO**

18 16. Plaintiff, Millennium, repeats and incorporates herein the entirety of the allegations
19 contained in paragraphs 1 through 15 above.

20 17. eCopy has for a long time past and still is infringing, actively inducing the
21 infringement of and contributorily infringing in this judicial district, the '508 patent by, among
22 other things, importing, making, using, offering for sale, and/or selling computer hardware,
23 software and systems, including but not limited to its eCopy Desktop product, in which information
24 from a hard copy document is extracted and transmitted to an application program in a manner
25 defined by the claims of the '508 patent without permission from Millennium and will continue to
26 do so unless enjoined by this Court.
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1 18. Plaintiff, Millennium, has been damaged by such infringing activities by the
2 Defendant, of the '508 patent and will be irreparably harmed unless such infringing activities are
3 enjoined by this Court.

4 **COUNT THREE**

5 19. Plaintiff, Millennium, repeats and incorporates herein the entirety of the allegations
6 contained in paragraphs 1 through 18 above.

7 20. eCopy has for a long time past and still is infringing, actively inducing the
8 infringement of and contributorily infringing in this judicial district, the '465 patent by, among
9 other things, importing, making, using, offering for sale, and/or selling computer hardware,
10 software and systems, including but not limited to its eCopy Desktop product, in which information
11 from a hard copy document is extracted and transmitted to an application program in a manner
12 defined by the claims of the '465 patent without permission from Millennium and will continue to
13 do so unless enjoined by this Court.

14 21. Plaintiff, Millennium, has been damaged by such infringing activities by the
15 Defendant of the '465 patent and will be irreparably harmed unless such infringing activities are
16 enjoined by this Court.

17 **COUNT FOUR**

18 22. Plaintiff, Millennium, repeats and incorporates herein the entirety of the allegations
19 contained in paragraphs 1 through 21 above.

20 23. eCopy has for a long time past and still is infringing, actively inducing the
21 infringement of and contributorily infringing in this judicial district, the '416 patent by, among
22 other things, importing, making, using, offering for sale, and/or selling computer hardware,
23 software and systems, including but not limited to its eCopy Desktop product, in which information
24 from a hard copy document is extracted and transmitted to an application program in a manner
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1 defined by the claims of the '416 patent without permission from Millennium and will continue to
2 do so unless enjoined by this Court.

3 24. Plaintiff, Millennium, has been damaged by such infringing activities by the
4 Defendant, of the '416 patent and will be irreparably harmed unless such infringing activities are
5 enjoined by this Court.

6 **COUNT FIVE**

7 25. Plaintiff, Millennium, repeats and incorporates herein the entirety of the allegations
8 contained in paragraphs 1 through 24 above.

9 26. eCopy has for a long time past and still is infringing, actively inducing the
10 infringement of and contributorily infringing in this judicial district, the '505 patent by, among
11 other things, importing, making, using, offering for sale, and/or selling computer hardware,
12 software and systems, including but not limited to its eCopy Desktop product, in which information
13 from a hard copy document is extracted and transmitted to an application program in a manner
14 defined by the claims of the '505 patent without permission from Millennium and will continue to
15 do so unless enjoined by this Court.

16 27. Plaintiff, Millennium, has been damaged by such infringing activities by the
17 Defendant, of the '505 patent and will be irreparably harmed unless such infringing activities are
18 enjoined by this Court.

19 **PRAYER FOR RELIEF**

20 WHEREFORE, Plaintiff, Millennium prays for judgment against the Defendant eCopy on
21 all the counts and for the following relief:

- 22 A. Declaration that the Plaintiff is the owner of the '855, '508, '465, '416 and '505
23 patents and that the Plaintiff has the right to sue and to recover for infringement
24 thereof;
- 25 B. Declaration that the '855, '508, '465, '416 and '505 patents are valid and
26 enforceable;
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- 1 C. Declaration that the Defendant has infringed, actively induced infringement of, and
2 contributorily infringed '855, '508, '465, '416 and '505 patents;
- 3 D. A preliminary and permanent injunction against the Defendant, each of its officers,
4 agents, servants, employees, and attorneys, all parent and subsidiary corporations,
5 their assigns and successors in interest, and those persons acting in active concert or
6 participation with them, including distributors and customers, enjoining them from
7 continuing acts of infringement, active inducement of infringement, and contributory
8 infringement of Millennium's '855, '508, '465, '416 and '505 patents;
- 9 E. An accounting for damages under 35 U.S.C. §284 for infringement of Millennium's
10 '855, '508, '465, '416 and '505 patents by the Defendant and the award of damages
11 so ascertained to the Plaintiff together with interest as provided by law;
- 12 F. Award of Millennium's costs and expenses; and
- 13 G. Such other and further relief as this Court may deem proper, just and equitable.

14 **DEMAND FOR JURY TRIAL**

15 Plaintiff, Millennium, demands a trial by jury of all issues properly triable by jury in this
16 action.
