FIRST AMENDED COMPLAINT FOR PATENT INFRINGEMENT

Times Three Clothier, LLC ("Times Three") sues Defendant LF USA, Inc. ("Li & Fung") and on information and belief, alleges as follows:

Introduction


1. Plaintiff Times Three owns the designs claimed in United States Design Patent Nos. 606, 285 ("the '285 Patent"); 616,627 ("the '627 Patent"); 622,477 ("the '477 Patent"); and 623,377 ("the '377 Patent") (collectively "the patents-in-suit"), each entitled "Garment." Defendant has used and continues to use Times Three's patented designs in products that it makes, uses, sells, and offers to sell, without Times Three's permission, and has induced, and continues to induce, others to infringe the patents-in-suit. Times Three seeks damages and/or a disgorgement of Defendant's total profits for patent infringement and an injunction preventing Defendant from making, using, selling, or offering to sell, and from inducing others to make, use, sell, or offer to sell, Plaintiff's patented designs without permission.

Jurisdiction and Venue

- 2. This is an action for patent infringement arising under the patent laws of the United States, 35 U.S.C. §§ 271 and 281, et seq. The Court has original jurisdiction over this patent infringement action under 28 U.S.C. §§ 1338(a).
- 3. Venue is proper in this Court because the Defendant is responsible for acts of infringement occurring in the Southern District of New York as alleged in this Complaint, and has delivered or caused to be delivered its infringing products in the Southern District of New York.

Plaintiff Times Three

- 4. Times Three is a limited liability company organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York, with its principal place of business in New York, New York.
- 5. Times Three is an independent manufacturer of shapewear garments that embody innovative designs that are marketed, distributed, and sold under the well-known brand names, Yummie Tummie®, I Am YummieTM, Tummy TankTM, TummyliciousTM (collectively, "Yummie Tummie®"). Times Three's expansive Yummie Tummie® product line was conceived and designed by Heather Thomson-Schindler, a fashion designer and creative director who has contributed to many acclaimed fashion collections, including Sean John by Sean Combs, Sweetface by Jennifer Lopez, and House of Deréon by Beyonce Knowles. An image of the Yummie Tumnie® "Strappy Tank" appears below:



- 6. Ms. Thomson-Schindler's designs are embodied in an expansive line of Yummie Tummie® products, all of which offer consumers effective, comfortable, attractive and fashion-forward women's shapewear. Times Three has launched a range of Yummie Tummie® branded shapewear products, including a variety of styles of tops, bottoms, apparel, and intimates for women of all sizes. Times Three's Yummie Tummie® line of shapewear is sold at such premium retailers as Saks Fifth Avenue, Nordstrom, The Home Shopping Network and Bloomingdales.
- 7. Times Three launched its Yummie Tummie® line of shapewear garments in January 2008, making Yummie Tummie ® the first brand of modern shapewear with an

aesthetically pleasing design, such that it was "meant to be seen" and could be worn as outerwear. Yummie Tummie® quickly became an overnight success. Only four months after its launch, Yummie Tummie® was featured in the May 16, 2008 episode of the Oprah Winfrey Show, during a segment entitled "Oprah's Favorite Things for Summer." Yummie Tummie® also appeared on the Tyra Banks Show, the Today Show, E! Daily 10, and Entertainment tonight, among many other television appearances.

Times Three's Design Patents

- 8. The United States Patent and Trademark Office issued the '285 Patent on December 22, 2009. A copy of the '285 Patent is attached hereto as Exhibit A. Through assignment, Times Three is the owner of all right, title, and interest, including rights for past infringements, in the '285 Patent.
- 9. The United States Patent and Trademark Office issued the '627 Patent on June 1, 2010. A copy of the '627 Patent is attached hereto as Exhibit B. Through assignment, Times Three is the owner of all right, title, and interest, including rights for past infringements, in the '627 Patent.
- 10. The United States Patent and Trademark Office issued the '477 Patent on August 31, 2010. A copy of the '477 Patent is attached hereto as Exhibit C. Through assignment, Times Three is the owner of all right, title, and interest, including rights for past infringements, in the '477 Patent.
- 11. The United States Patent and Trademark Office issued the '377 Patent on September 14, 2010. A copy of the '377 Patent is attached hereto as Exhibit D. Through assignment, Times Three is the owner of all right, title, and interest, including rights for past infringements, in the '377 Patent.


12. Times Three has complied with the statutory requirement of placing a notice of the patents-in-suit on all necessary garments it manufactures and sells.

Defendant Li & Fung

13. Li & Fung is a Delaware corporation, with its principal place of business in New York, NY.

Li & Fung's Acts of Infringement

14. Defendant has used and continues to use the designs of the patents-in-suit in products that it makes, uses, sells, and offers to sell, without Times Three's permission, including, but not limited to, Defendant's "Logo by Lori Goldstein Instant Chic," (Style No's. A214474, A199948, A209786, and A202824 (the "Knock-Off-Garments"), which Li & Fung sells to QVC, Inc. ("QVC"). An image of the Logo – Instant Chic, Style No. A214474 appears below:



- 15. In 2009, Mr. Richard Darling, President of Li & Fung contacted Ms. Thomson-Schindler and requested a meeting to discuss Times Three's Yummie Tummie ® line of garments. Thereafter, Ms. Thomson-Schindler, her business partner Michelle Daray, and Yummie Tummie® Chairman Eric Rothfeld met with Mr. Darling, who acknowledged Yummie Tummie®'s impressive growth since its launch, and inquired as to whether Times Three would have any interest in working with Li & Fung. Ms. Thomson-Schindler, Ms. Daray, and Mr. Rothfeld informed Mr. Darling that Times Three's Yummie Tummie® line of garments were the subject of a patent application pending with at the United States Patent and Trademark Office that they believed would issue.
- 16. On information and belief, Li & Fung intentionally designed the Knock-Off-Garments to copy the designs embodied by the patents-in-suit, in order to trade off of the innovative, patented designs that are associated with Times Three's Yummie Tummie® line of shapewear garments. The design of the Knock-Off-Garments are strikingly similar to the design of Times Three's Yummie Tummie line of shapewear garments and the design embodied by the patents-in-suit.
- 17. Defendant was aware of the patents-in-suit at least as early as January 20, 2010, when Times Three informed it, by letter, that the '285 Patent had issued to Times Three.
- 18. Defendant was aware that it was infringing the patents-in-suit at least as early as September 21, 2011, when Times Three sent Li & Fung a cease and desist letter, informing Li & Fung that the Patent and Trademark Office had issued the '627, '377, and '477 Patents to Times Three. Times Three also demanded that Li & Fung refrain from further infringing Times Three's patents and compensate Times Three for its past infringement. Since that time, the parties have been unable to resolve this matter.

- 19. Defendant has induced, and continues to induce others, including QVC and other third party garment retailers and garment purchasers, to infringe the patents-in-suit by making, using, offering for sale, and selling the Knock-Off-Garments without Times Three's permission.
- 20. On information and belief, Defendant specifically intended to cause QVC to infringe the patents-in-suit and aided and abetted QVC's direct infringement of the patents-in-suit by, inter alia, convincing QVC to sell the Knock-Off-Garments, providing marketing and promotional materials for the Knock-Off-Garments to QVC, delivering the Knock-Off-Garments to QVC, and otherwise encouraging retail sales of the Knock-Off-Garments by QVC.
- 21. On information and belief, Defendant has induced, and continues to induce others, including Ms. Lori Goldstein and other third party garment designers to infringe the patents-insuit by making, using, offering for sale, and selling the Knock-Off-Garments without Times Three's permission.
- 22. On information and belief, Defendant specifically intended to cause Ms. Goldstein to infringe the patents-in-suit and aided and abetted Ms. Goldstein's direct infringement of the patents-in-suit by, inter alia, providing samples of Times Three's Yummie Tummie ® garments to Ms. Goldstein, knowing the design of the same to be patented, and requesting that Ms. Goldstein make garment(s) that would appear substantially similar to Times Three's Yummie Tummie® garments.
- 23. On information and belief, Defendant has induced, and continues to induce others, including unknown third party importers to infringe the patents-in-suit by importing the Knock-Off-Garments without Times Three's permission from the Philippines, where they are manufactured.

24. On information and belief, Defendant specifically intended to cause third party importers to infringe the patents-in-suit and aided and abetted such third party importers' direct infringement of the patents-in-suit by, inter alia, delivering the Knock-Off-Garments to third parties in the Philippines and directing them to import the Knock-Off-Garments to the United States.

COUNT I (DESIGN PATENT INFRINGEMENT, 35 U.S.C. §§ 271 AND 281)

- 25. Times Three incorporates the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 24 as though fully set forth herein.
- 26. Li & Fung has been and, on information and belief, still is making, using, offering to sell, selling, and/or importing in the United States Knock-Off-Garments that infringe the '285 Patent in violation of 35 U.S.C. § 271(a).
- 27. On information and belief, Li & Fung has been and still is actively inducing others to infringe the '285 Patent in violation of 35 U.S.C. § 271(b).
- 28. On information and belief, Li & Fung's infringement has been intentional and willful, making this an exceptional case.
- 29. By reason of Li & Fung's infringement, Times Three has suffered, and unless Li & Fung's conduct is permanently enjoined, will continue to suffer, actual damages and irreparable harm, as to which it has no adequate remedy at law.

COUNT II (DESIGN PATENT INFRINGEMENT, 35 U.S.C. §§ 271 AND 281)

30. Times Three incorporates the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 24 and 26 through 29 as though fully set forth herein.

- 31. Li & Fung has been and, on information and belief, still is making, using, offering to sell, selling, and/or importing in the United States Knock-Off-Garments that infringe the '627 Patent in violation of 35 U.S.C. § 271(a).
- 32. On information and belief, Li & Fung has been and still is actively inducing others to infringe the '627 Patent in violation of 35 U.S.C. § 271(b).
- 33. On information and belief, Li & Fung's infringement has been intentional and willful, making this an exceptional case.
- 34. By reason of Li & Fung's infringement, Times Three has suffered, and unless Li & Fung's conduct is permanently enjoined, will continue to suffer, actual damages and irreparable harm, as to which it has no adequate remedy at law.

COUNT III (DESIGN PATENT INFRINGEMENT, 35 U.S.C. §§ 271 AND 281)

- 35. Times Three incorporates the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 24, 26 through 29, and 31 through 34 as though fully set forth herein.
- 36. Li & Fung has been and, on information and belief, still is making, using, offering to sell, selling, and/or importing in the United States Knock-Off-Garments that infringe the '477 Patent in violation of 35 U.S.C. § 271(a).
- 37. On information and belief, Li & Fung has been and still is actively inducing others to infringe the '477 Patent in violation of 35 U.S.C. § 271(b).
- 38. On information and belief, Li & Fung's infringement has been intentional and willful, making this an exceptional case.
- 39. By reason of Li & Fung's infringement, Times Three has suffered, and unless Li & Fung's conduct is permanently enjoined, will continue to suffer, actual damages and irreparable harm, as to which it has no adequate remedy at law.

COUNT IV (DESIGN PATENT INFRINGEMENT, 35 U.S.C. §§ 271 AND 281)

- 40. Times Three incorporates the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 24, 26 through 29, 31 through 34, and 36 through 39 as though fully set forth herein.
- 41. Li & Fung has been and, on information and belief, still is making, using, offering to sell, selling, and/or importing in the United States Knock-Off-Garments that infringe the '377 Patent in violation of 35 U.S.C. § 271(a).
- 42. On information and belief, Li & Fung has been and still is actively inducing others to infringe the '377 Patent in violation of 35 U.S.C. § 271(b).
- 43. On information and belief, Li & Fung's infringement has been intentional and willful, making this an exceptional case.
- 44. By reason of Li & Fung's infringement, Times Three has suffered, and unless Li & Fung's conduct is permanently enjoined, will continue to suffer, actual damages and irreparable harm, as to which it has no adequate remedy at law.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Times Three respectfully requests that this Court:

- 1. Enter judgment in favor of Times Three;
- 2. Permanently enjoin Li & Fung and its predecessors, successors, divisions, subsidiaries, or joint ventures thereof, together with any and all parent or affiliated companies or corporations, and all officers, directors, employees, agents, attorneys, representatives, those acting in privity or concern with Li & Fung, or on its behalf, from further infringing the '285 Patent, and from inducing others to infringe the '285 Patent;

- 3. Permanently enjoin Li & Fung and its predecessors, successors, divisions, subsidiaries, or joint ventures thereof, together with any and all parent or affiliated companies or corporations, and all officers, directors, employees, agents, attorneys, representatives, those acting in privity or concern with Li & Fung, or on its behalf, from further infringing the '627 Patent, and from inducing others to infringe the '627 Patent;
- 4. Permanently enjoin Li & Fung and its predecessors, successors, divisions, subsidiaries, or joint ventures thereof, together with any and all parent or affiliated companies or corporations, and all officers, directors, employees, agents, attorneys, representatives, those acting in privity or concern with Li & Fung, or on its behalf, from further infringing the '477 Patent, and from inducing others to infringe the '477 Patent;
- 5. Permanently enjoin Li & Fung and its predecessors, successors, divisions, subsidiaries, or joint ventures thereof, together with any and all parent or affiliated companies or corporations, and all officers, directors, employees, agents, attorneys, representatives, those acting in privity or concern with Li & Fung, or on its behalf, from further infringing the '377 Patent, and from inducing others to infringe the '377 Patent;
- 6. Award Times Three its actual damages under 35 U.S.C. § 284 in an amount to be determined at trial, including its lost profits resulting from sales of the Knock-Off-Garments by Li & Fung and OVC;

- 7. Award Times Three enhanced damages up to three times the amount found or assessed under 35 U.S.C. § 284, as a result of Li & Fung's knowing and willful infringement;
- 8. Award Times Three the disgorged total profits of Li & Fung under 35 U.S.C. §289 from infringing the patents-in-suit in an amount to be determined at trial;
- Award Times Three punitive damages because of Li & Fung's knowing, willful, and deliberate bad faith acts of unfair competition in an amount to be determined at trial;
- 10. Award Times Three all of its actual costs and reasonable attorneys' fees in this action as authorized by 35 U.S.C. § 285; and
- 11. Grant to Times Three such other and further relief as may be just and warranted under the circumstances.

JURY TRIAL DEMAND

Times Three demands a trial by jury on all issues so triable.




FIG. 6 is a left elevation view of Embodiment 2, of a multifabrie garment.
























































